My reasons for my objection or submission are:

It seems a shame that a hut constructed only 7 years ago, and actually safe and sound as a building, has to be rebuilt due to some problems with the foundations not meeting code.

It is ironic that if the original hut had been in sounder condition such that it could have been repaired, it would now be perfectly fine to use, even if far below the standard of the present hut.

I understand the need for rules around the standard of alpine structures, but it seems what is lacking here is the bureaucratic processes taking precedence over common sense.

#### Concession application - Leaning Lodge Hut (OT-23405-ACC)

Federated Mountain Clubs (FMC) was founded in 1931 and advocates for the backcountry and outdoor recreation on behalf of over 21,000 members in 96 clubs. The Otago Tramping and Mountaineering Club (OTMC) is one of those clubs. FMC has taken a leading role in the establishment of protection and ongoing robust planning for much of New Zealand's public conservation land. It is with pleasure that we write in support of the OTMC's application for a concession to construct a replacement for Leaning Lodge.

As we noted in our submission on the Visitor Facilities Review in 2004, the original Leaning Lodge is part of the fabric of a long history of recreational use on the Rock and Pillar Range which predates by several decades the range's status as conservation land. Changing expectations of facilities, changing recreational patterns and the move from clubs representing the majority of recreational users to a minority meant that the Otago Ski Club and Otago University Ski Club each in turn relinquished ownership of the hut when it was no longer practical for each club to maintain it. The OTMC was reaching a similar point in the early part of the century, but decided that it wanted to see a hut retained there. The Leaning Lodge Trust was established under the guidance of the OTMC to bring together recreational, scientific and local community interests with a view to ensuring that this important recreational resource remained. Unfortunately, the hut built in 2013 has problems and needs to be replaced.

We see this new hut as a valuable complement to the range of recreational opportunities and facilities in the area. We note that the department has a policy of no huts in the nearby Te Papanui Conservation Park — a stance that we support. The provision of huts on the Rock & Pillar Range by community groups is consistent with the Recreational Opportunities Spectrum approach to wildlands management. The 2013 hut, along with the restoration of Big Hut, led to a renaissance in usage of the area, similar to what has occurred in the Silver Peaks following the building of a new Jubilee Hut in 2007. We want to see that continue.

We see Leaning Lodge as complementary to the retention of Big Hut. The Leaning Lodge site is easier to get to, to find and to depart from in adverse conditions, making it a more suitable venue for less experienced parties.
