

Summary of Abel Tasman Foreshore Scenic Reserve Management Plan

Provisions for Cruise Ship Activity

<p>Awaroa Beach (FAPL#) and Anchorage, Bark Bay, Onetahuti, Sawpit Point and Totaranui (FANP*) Coastal Access Points</p>	<p>Torrent Bay Coastal Access Point (FAPL#); Medlands Bay Coastal Access Point (FANP*); South Coast (FANP* & FAPL#); and North Coast and Awaroa Vehicle Access Corridor (FANP*)</p>
<p>Can drop off/pick up passengers between 7am and 6pm.</p> <p>At Sawpit Point and Bark Bay a maximum of 40 guests per day are allowed (at each Coastal Access Point).</p> <p>At all other Coastal Access Points there should be no more than 40 guests at a time on the reserve.</p> <p>Landings at the western Anchorage Coastal Access Point can only occur by vessels with on-board toilets and sewage holding tanks.</p> <p>No more than 7 tenders, water taxis or other commercial vessels can be used to transport guests between the ship and the reserve.</p> <p>No more than 200 guests in total can enter the reserve per visit.</p>	<p>No landings.</p>
