

Vision

Aspirational

"To promote the recovery and ensure the longterm viability of New Zealand sea lions"





Scope of the TMP

- Five year plan
- Works towards the Vision
- Assess ALL threats
- Prioritise threats for management / mitigation
- Includes ALL sub-populations* and breeding sites*





Structure of Management Goals

- Three Management Goals:
 - Population goal
 - Research and Monitoring goal
 - Community goal
- Each goal has associated management criteria detailing how progress will be measured





Draft Population Goal

20 year: The overall population is above 2017 levels and shows signs of ongoing improvement

Site-specific:

- Stop/reverse the decline at the Auckland Islands
- Evidence of population growth is present on the Mainland,
 Stewart Island, and Campbell Island

5 year: The overall population shows progress towards achieving the 20-year goal.





Population Goal – Management Criteria

- Population indicators (demographic parameters) will be monitored at each subpopulation to assess progress:
 - Auckland Island & Mainland parameters: direct pup counts, pup survival
 & female survival determined from model output
 - Campbell Island & Stewart Island: direct pup counts
- Achieve and maintain at least three subpopulations
- Trigger points will be identified that would trigger immediate review of the TMP or other management actions





Draft Research and Monitoring Goal

A structured research and monitoring programme enables progress towards achieving the vision and goals of the TMP





Research & Monitoring - Management Criteria

- All research and monitoring aligns with the TMP objectives and priorities
- All researchers working on sea lion-related projects collaborate with government agencies to ensure that management is fully informed with the best available data
- All research and monitoring used to inform management is subject to a robust review process





Community Goal

Communities and stakeholders are involved and engaged in the conservation of New Zealand sea lions





Community Goal – Management Criteria

- Public understanding (of NZSLs, their importance & their threats) has substantially improved
- Treaty settlement obligations in relation to sea lions are met
- The number of sea lion deaths due to human interactions on the mainland has decreased
- Public involvement in the conservation of the New Zealand sea lion has improved through readily available community engagement opportunities.
